Guidance on Likelihood and Severity

Likelihood of Occurrence		
Not Likely	1	There is no risk at present. Only under freak conditions could there be any possibility of an accident or illness. All reasonable precautions appear to have been taken. This should be the normal state of the workplace.
Possible	2	If other contributing factors become present an accident or illness might occur, but the probability is low and the risk is minimal (e.g. chipped glass window, slightly worn steps).
Quite Possible	3	An accident may happen if significant additional factors precipitate it, but it is unlikely to happen without them. The additional factor is more than a casual slip and a nudge and would require an additional action or event to trigger it (e.g. leaving a vehicle with engine running, obstructing an aisle causing a trip hazard).
Likely	4	An accident is "likely" to happen if significant additional factors precipitate it i.e. wind, human error/carelessness etc. but which is unlikely to happen without this additional factor (e.g. ladder not secured, pile of tubes with temporary or makeshift wedge, temporary electrical hook-up to live supply).
Very Likely	5	If the work continues as it is, there is almost 100% certainty that an accident will happen (e.g. broken stair or broken round on a ladder, exposed electrical conductor, tall stack of heavy articles poorly supported).

Severity of Risk		
Negligible	1	Negligible risk of injury, disease, or financial loss/damage
Minor	2	Minor injury which would allow the individual to continue work after First aid treatment. The duration of the stoppage or treatment is such that the normal flow of work is not seriously interrupted. No adverse media coverage. Minimal financial loss or damage.
Moderate (Serious)	3	Causing moderate injury or disease capable of keeping an individual off work for seven days or more (RIDDOR reportable). Potential for moderate financial loss (from damage to equipment/litigation etc). Adverse media coverage. Moderate business interruption.
High (Major)	4	Causing serious injury to an individual that is "notifiable". Significant potential for financial loss, disruption to Organisation. Potential for litigation/prosecution by failure to significantly conform with statutory duties. Adverse media coverage. Potential prosecution.
Very High (Fatality)	5	Causing single or multiple deaths and/or severe disruption to the Organisation. Potential for extreme financial loss. Adverse national media coverage. Significant litigation cost potential. Potential prosecution of Organisation/individuals.

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
